Doosan Forklift Part - Doosan Infracore Company Ltd. is an international organization consisting of Diesel Engines, Defense Industry products, Industrial Vehicles, Construction Technologies and Machine Instruments and Automation Systems.

In the United States, Doosan Infracore America Corporation is headquartered in Suwanee, Georgia. It is home to a 170,000 square foot production facility, which is the home of the Compact Equipment and Construction division. West Caldwell, New Jersey is home to the Machine Tool division and Cleveland, Concord is home to the Lift truck division. The U.S. headquarters in Georgia facilitates a first rate parts operation capable of supplying an excess of 25,000 line items to support Lift Truck, Compact Equipment, Machine Tool and Construction customer needs.

There are well over 220 Doosan service and sales locations operating in Canada and the United States. In addition, there are more than 90 independent sellers moving forklift materials and materials handling equipment. This network helps Doosan Infracore America to aggressively compete in this competitive market. The lift truck product line impressively comprises of 63 different products consisting of 82 various battery and engine configurations of Electric-powered and Internal Combustion forklifts. Capacities of these various truck versions range from 3,000 to 33,000 lbs. All vehicles are manufactured in an ISO 9001 certified facility.

Doosan Infracore America is the fastest expanding forklift company in the North American market, due to their consistency in retaining a high level of consumer service quality and optimum product performance to all Doosan Infracore Forklift users. The U.S. lift Truck division located in Cleveland has a professional team knowledgeable in Sales, Purchasing, Advertising, Logistical and Technical Support.

Korea's original home-based forklift marketplace was an open-import enterprise. In the 1960's, Korea Machinery Co. Ltd. began to import assembled forklifts as part of a national machinery expansion venture. Early product sales of this manufacturing equipment focused on large business communities, the armed services and on state-run corporations. This eventually led to a merger with Daewoo Heavy Industries Ltd. In 1976, the Forklift Division commenced trade operations throughout Korea to overhaul and sell this heavy equipment. By 1978, a lift truck production plant was successfully completed. Continuous technical education became the new focus for enhancing quality and product development.

Daewoo began the first home-based forklift business in 1967, and quickly acquired a massive 90% share in the Korean Materials Handling market. By the 1980's, Daewoo's superior technological improvements combined with sales success placed them in a situation of substantial expansion of their forklift operations.

Caterpillar Industrial Inc. of the U.S. in 1981, proposed a joint venture project to help them in the highly competitive North American materials handling market. This project proved highly successful for Daewoo and their lift truck sales expanded greatly. In 1984, the company completed development of a new facility to help in manufacturing high end value-added products for export. In 1993, the company had a international sales system and started exporting designs they had established through in-house expertise, as an sovereign product. Certifications were then acquired from CE of Europe, UL of the United States and ISO 14001 and ISO 9001, securing expansion opportunities into international marketplaces.
